

Faithfulness: The Unforgettable Attribute

“Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful” I Corinthians 4:2

In **Yellowstone National Park** there is a geyser that is called **“Old Faithful.”** This is because it erupts **every 67 minutes**, day in and day out. It is not the most beautiful and spectacular geyser in the park, but it is the most dependable. I’ve seen other geysers in Yellowstone, but the only one I can remember by name is “Old Faithful.”

Would you consider yourself a faithful member of Victory Baptist Church? Pastor David Cummins asked these **questions** to the members of Faith Baptist Church, the church he pastored, **concerning faithfulness:**

1. Is a car that starts once out of seven times a “faithful” car?
2. Is a refrigerator that quits for a day now and then really “faithful?”
3. Is your paper boy “faithful” if he misses you with the paper every few days?
4. If you fail to check in at work two or three times a week, would you be considered “faithful” to your job?
5. If your hot water heater greeted you with cold water one or two mornings a week, would you consider it dependable?
6. Now if you fail to come to worship a God once or twice a month, are you really “faithful?”

Note that our text says **“Be found faithful.”** The idea communicated is that at any time, without notice, you can “pop in” on the faithful and you will indeed find them faithful. A faithful man serves *“not with eye service [when being watched] as men pleasers; but as the servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart”* (Ephesians 6:6).

Dr. Bob Jones, Sr. said “The Greatest **ability** is **dependability.**” Are you faithful in your attendance? In giving? In praying? In your obligation? Will Christ say unto you *“Well done, thou good and faithful servant?”* Victory Baptist Church needs a church full of “Old Faithfuls!”
